The Molly Maguires were Hibernians, involved in the labor struggles in the Pennsylvania coal mines and were executed for it. Numerous Irish Americans have risen through the ranks of their unions to be the President of International Unions including: Teddy Gleeson (ILA), John Lawe (TWU), Terry O'Sullivan (Laborer's International Union), John Samuelson (TWU) Mary Kay Henry (SEIU), John Sweeney (AFL-CIO President). As we observe Labor Day Weekend, we can be proud of the contributions of Irish Americans to the Labor movement.

I made comments at the State convention that I believe are worth repeating. Anyone who attended

the State convention in Binghamton and listened to the reports given by the appointed officers has to be impressed with the amount of work that was done by the both the elected and appointed officers in the last two years. It is obvious that the group that was selected took their role seriously and worked very hard for our organization. It would not be right to single out any individual officer because it would necessarily leave out another fully deserving brother. Those of you who have been following the activities I have been most involved in are aware that our efforts to have New York State law amended to create a presumption that many crimes that may be committed in or around a house of worship would automatically be deemed hate crimes did not pass this year's legislative session. As a result of the timing of our efforts, it was extremely difficult to rush anything through the Assembly and the Senate. Lots of brothers did hard work and I believe there is a full commitment by the Ad-Hoc Committee created by President Manning to continue their work under President O'Donnell to get this legislation passed. As previously reported, the key to passage includes engaging key members of other religions and faiths so that this bill can enjoy widespread support as we push it forward. While we fell short towards the late Spring of last year, we are using this time to create a strategy moving forward so that we can have this extremely important legislation passed. Stay tuned for future reports about these efforts.

Finally, as of the writing of this digest piece, the transition of office is still ongoing. I am hoping in the next digest to provide a true treasurer's report to give the order an idea as to where we stand and to how we are doing financially.

I hope that the members all had a wonderful summer in 2023 and I look forward to seeing many of you at various Division, County, State and National events.



TIM WEKLAR ORGANIZER

First off, I want to thank everyone that came out to Binghamton to our biannual NYS AOH Convention, all the Brothers that are stepping up into new leadership positions and our host Brothers and Sisters in Broome County for the fantastic hospitality. I also want to thank NYS President Tom O'Donnell for reappointing me to State Organizer.

As we reported at the State Convention, the State grew 3% over the past 2 years as we came out of COVID lock downs. The strongest growth in District 1 (Capital District) and District 7 (Long Island). We currently have 8674 members and hope to be on the road back to 9000 plus. To be successful we need to continue to be proactive and deliberate in our recruitment and retention practices.

Since the convention I have made a spreadsheet of all the division and county organizers with contact information to communicate and disseminate best practices. Unfortunately, only 51% of all the Boards have Organizers appointed. I know that there are only a few months before we elect new leadership at the division level, please make appointing an Organizer a priority. Divisions that have full Form 9s are the divisions that are showing growth. Giving a Brother an appointed position like Organizer is giving a Brother a reason to come back to a meeting. Imagine the growth we could have if we had another 20 Brothers across the State dedicated to growing the Order! I plan on contacting Presidents without Organizers to fill their Form 9s and remind incoming Presidents to make the Organizer's appointment a top priority.

As we approach the Fall Board Meeting, I will be looking to appoint Deputy Organizers that can prioritize initiatives and help implement them at the local level. I hope we can start to make more inroads to starting new divisions in the North County region of New York State and offer help to divisions dangerously close to disbanding. I also hope to create a pamphlet that explains the Organizers position along with best practices and links to resources. We will also look to partner with the webmaster, social media and publicity chairman to promote recruitment (especially to the younger demographic). We will be reevaluating our on-line poster campaign to make it more efficient and make the poster available to download and print in any size.

Newly elected District Directors and County Presidents, please consider doing a needs assessment in your territory about whether your area would benefit from a new recruitment tent. In District 1 two years ago, all the divisions in the district pitched in \$280 and purchased a recruitment tent for \$1400 which included the weights for the legs. Our district director is in charge of usage of the tent for recruitment at division events.

Just recently District 1 had over 100 AOH and LAOH members at a minor league baseball game in Troy, NY that got 4 applications at the recruitment tent. Please consider district wide events with district wide recruitment opportunities.

All three days are observances to honor those who have served in the military. Celebrated the last Monday in May, Memorial Day is the holiday set aside to pay tribute to those who died serving in the military. This includes those who died during war, those who died preparing for war, and those who died later because of war. Memorial Day is a solemn remembrance and I would certainly caution the phrase "Happy Memorial Day"!

According to Military.com, Veterans Day began as Armistice Day to honor the end of World War I, which officially took place on November 11, 1918. Veterans Day honors all those who have served. Their service is not dependent on the location they were stationed, the nature of their duties, nor the amount of time they served. This day is for combat veterans and non-combat veterans alike. We honor everyone who honorably served. Armed Forces Day is celebrated on the third Saturday in May, and it is the day Americans celebrate their military members presently serving, without regard to branch or component.

COMMODORE BARRY WILLIAM FLYNN

I'm hoping everyone had a grand Summer and family time enjoyed by all. On September 13th we will commemorate a day dedicated to a great Irish-American naval officer. President Ronald Reagan designated September 13, 1981, as "Commodore John Barry Day" as a **"tribute to one of the earliest and greatest American Patriots,** a man of great insight who perceived very early the need for American power on the sea." Barry was born in Wexford, Ireland, in 1745. Barry received the first commission issued by the Continental Congress to command Lexington on December 7, 1775, becoming a Revolutionary War Commander. He rose from a humble Irish cabin boy to senior commander of the entire United States fleet. He was fearless in battle, but humane to his men as well as adversaries and prisoners.

Barry's war contributions: he was the first to capture a British war vessel on the high seas; he captured two British ships after being severely wounded in a ferocious sea battle; he quelled three mutinies; he fought on land at the Battles of Trenton and Princeton; he captured over 20 ships including an armed British schooner in the lower Delaware; he authored a Signal Book which established a set of signals used for effective communication between ships; he also fought the last naval battle of the American Revolution aboard the frigate Alliance in 1783. He was the first US Naval Flag Officer. Barry was Appointed in 1795 by President George Washington to plan the construction of and later to be in command of the first US Navy launched in 1798. Commodore John Barry had such insight and vision of a strong navy to command the high seas.

He died in Philadelphia, PA in 1803. Commodore John Barry is also known as "The Father of the American Navy", a title bestowed on him by his contemporaries, who were in the best position to judge. He shares that moniker with John Paul Jones and John Adams.

Commodore John Barry Day is an AOH National Holiday. Again, this year it is my hope and desire for every Ancient Order of Hibernians Division in the grand State of New York to commemorate, "Commodore John Barry Day" in some way during the month of September. Examples/suggestions: Irish Flag Raising, Facebook posting, newspaper article, website etc.

PRO-LIFE EDWARD J. WALLACE

First, I want to thank NYS Pres. Tom O'Donnell for reappointing me Chairman. of the Pro-Life Committee, I will strive to keep members abreast of latest happenings in the fight to end or limit abortion in our country.

U. S. Congressman. Alex Mooney (R-WV) is promoting a Life at Conception Act. The Supreme court itself admitted in Roe v Wade that once Congress establishes the personhood of unborn children, they must be protected by the 14th Amendment to the Constitution, which explicitly says: "nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty or property."

Senator Cindy Hyde-Smith and Congressman Robert Latta introduced "Save Babies Act" (S95/H.R. 427) which will immediately end the licensing of abortion pills and stop the abortion lobby's scheme to deal out abortion pills without oversight (Nat'l Pro-Life Alliance).

A federal appeals court recently ruled that the city of Washington, DC, unevenly enforced the "defacement ordinances" against pro-life groups. The court ruled that city authorities treated pro-life protesters more harshly than Black Lives Matter activists. (Catholic vote).

Catholics in Ohio have been urged by Archbishop Shurr to reject a November ballot that would make abortion a "right" under their state constitution. (CV)

SOCIAL MEDIA CHAD GHASTIN

Facebook remains our best performing social media platform. Since taking over social media in July 2021, we have significantly increased key audience engagement metrics using month-long themed posts for Veterans Day, Bloody Sunday Memorials, and on key holidays and events. It should be noted that these results were achieved from organic content and not from any paid media content / posts.

July 2021 vs. July 2023 Facebook Results

- Grew Total Page Followers from 1,844 to 3,065, an addition of 1,221 or +66%
- Grew Total Page Likes from = 1,853 to 2,511, an addition of 658 or +36%
- Reached 223,000 people by positing 730 total posts or one post per day over two years.

All Time Engagement Record

The February 17, 2023 Facebook post listing NY St. Patrick's State parades reached a record breaking 34,000 total people, generated 985 reactions, 131 comments and 284 shares. This post reached 26,000 more people than our previously highest engaging post.

5 Simple Ways to Increase Member Recruitment and Engagement Using Social Media

- 1. Appoint a member to own and run your social media. This is the prefect opportunity to appoint a Brother to as your "media and communications chair" and empower them to run your social media program.
- 2. Share your social media pages with your members and frequently ask them to follow you and share you posts.
- Increase the frequency of your post to at least once a week. When a member candidate visits your social pages, they want to see that you are active. This is especially true for younger "digital native" generations. If you don't have the time to create content, you can easily share content from the NY State AOH social media pages (i.e., Facebook) on your pages.

- Create a custom Facebook username. This helps the public find and tag you on Facebook. Custom usernames are part of your public profile that appears on your home / profile Facebook page. For example, the NY State AOH Facebook username is: @new.york.aoh.
- Add hashtags to your social posts to increase your reach and followers and engagement. Examples include: #AOH, #Irish, #Irishheritage, #Catholic

I was lucky enough to speak at a breakout meeting at the NYS Convention in Binghamton in July to share many of the activities and accomplishments going on in the Junior Divisions across the State. I also implored many of the Division Officers in attendance to very much consider implementing Junior Divisions. These young men are our future and we need to encourage enrollment if we are to grow our organization for the future. LEGAL COUNSEL AND IMMIGRATION TOM LAMBERT

I hope all are enjoying their summer months. I would like to thank President O'Donnell for appointing me to the positions of Legal Counsel and Immigration Chairman. I appreciate the confidence placed in me. Regarding my position as Legal Counsel, I will be available to offer legal advice to the AOH New York State Board when asked for an opinion.

Regarding Immigration, I am also AOH National Immigration Chairman. I will keep our Brothers apprised of any changes in U.S. Immigration policy, especially if there is any effect on Irish Immigration. In this regard, the calendar moves forward, but there is no progress on Immigration. The bipartisan Immigration bill introduced in the House of Representatives, the "Dignity Act of 2023", has been passed in the House, but not in the Senate. Observers note there is no clear path for approval in the Senate. The bill combines proposals to increase security at our borders with provisions to revise the process for seeking asylum.

The Ancient Order of Hibernians has continued to push very hard for a revision of the current E3 Visa to allow approximately 5,000 unused visas, from the 10,500 visas previously allocated to Australia, to be reallocated to Ireland on an annual basis. While in Washington DC earlier this spring, AOH President O'Connell had occasion to speak to Congressional leadership. He made it clear to the leadership that it has long been the position of the AOH that any Immigration bill should allow for a revised E-3 Visa. Leadership was receptive, but there is still a lack of progress. We will continue to monitor this fluid situation in possible immigration reform. Our work continues!

Lastly, if your Division, County or State has yet to have prepared an updated Form 9, please do so ASAP and submit it to our National Secretary. Please don't forget to include Officers for all positions, including Immigration. As always, I would be happy to work with any local Immigration Chair.
